

CHECK to SPEC:

Scope:

- Comprehensive Bench Check utilizing Hasselblad specific Test Equipment and Measuring Tools
- Evaluation of each piece to Hasselblad specs, condition, and for working order
- Exterior cleaning
- Some tweaking if item is found to be in generally good working order and doesn't require ROUTINE SERVICE

ROUTINE SERVICE explained

The V system cameras owe their rugged reliability to a Mechanical Design and do require periodic Maintenance

Scope:

- The internal working mechanism is disassembled to the sub assembly level or further
- Each component piece is individually cleaned, inspected, and re-lubricated
- [Included] Small parts are replaced as needed using only genuine Hasselblad parts [*High value parts may be excepted]
- Careful reassembly and preliminary adjustments are made
- Final adjustments – Functional Check – and External Cleaning complete the service

FAQ : Why do I need to service my camera?

- Lubricants, seals, and dampers can begin to deteriorate after 5 years, Hasselblads should be checked and/or serviced [especially after sitting unused for a while]. Performance and reliability can begin to deteriorate, light leaks, focus issues, and exposure inaccuracies can begin to occur.
- Most of the cameras received at Hasselblad have generally been well cared for, but do fall in to this category and are recommended for Routine Service

Though rare, some exceptions that may incur additional labor and/or parts cost - External / Internal Damage caused by:

- Salt, Water, Moisture, Sand, Corrosion, or Fungus
- Excessive Force [impact damage or improper operation] including physically broken parts
- External or Internal modifications - or failed repairs done by other parties
- Very High Usage Cameras may also require extended or more frequent service intervals.

V System Cameras and Accessories No Longer Serviced:

Cameras: All cameras, lenses, film magazines, and accessories manufactured prior to 1957

- 1600f – Camera bodies, Lenses, and Magazines
- 1000f – Camera bodies, Lenses, and Magazines
